The primary purpose of the SILC is to develop a three-year state plan that determines the allocation of independent living federal funds for services and projects that are designed to remove barriers to independent living. The Council includes representation of individuals with cross disabilities from various geographic parts of the state.

The SILC board members are appointed by the Governor with the majority of members being people with disabilities (two-thirds of voting members) that aren't employed by a Center for Independent Living (CIL) or any State agency. SILC meetings are held on a quarterly basis (January, April, July and October) from 12:00-3:00 p.m. Meetings may be conducted via Zoom or similar platform.
